ADOLESCENT HEALTH INITIATIVE

For young people experiencing the traumas of community violence, school-based health centers (SBHC) can be a lifeline. But how can SBHC staff approach their interactions with adolescents in a sensitive, empowering way?

The Adolescent Health Initiative's latest no-cost resource on Community Violence explores trauma, community violence, trauma-informed care, youth engagement, and youth-adult partnerships, and how school-based health centers can foster partnerships with youth to address community violence.
