

# How to get money back on Venmo if scammed?

Getting money back on **Venmo** after being scammed can be challenging, but it is not always impossible. Because Venmo is designed primarily for sending money to people you know and trust, transactions are typically processed instantly and are difficult to reverse. However, if you act quickly and follow the correct steps, you may improve your chances of recovering lost funds or preventing further damage.

The first thing to do after realizing you've been scammed is to review the transaction details within the Venmo app. If the payment is still marked as "pending," there may be a brief window where it can be canceled. If the payment has already been completed, you should immediately contact the recipient through the app and request a refund. In rare cases, especially if the scammer used a stolen or mistaken identity, the recipient may cooperate. However, in most scam situations, you will need to escalate the issue.

Next, report the transaction to Venmo Support directly through the app. Navigate to the help section, select the specific transaction, and choose the option to report a problem. Provide detailed information, including screenshots, conversation history, and any evidence showing the fraudulent behavior. Venmo will review your case to determine whether it violates their policies. If the payment involved unauthorized access to your account—such as someone hacking into your profile—Venmo may investigate under its unauthorized transaction protection guidelines.

If your Venmo account was compromised, you should immediately change your password, enable two-factor authentication, and review linked bank accounts or cards for suspicious activity. If your bank account or debit card was used to fund the

transaction, contact your bank right away. Some banks may allow you to dispute the charge, especially if it was unauthorized.
